

## The Hills of Home and Grandpa

### Part 3-Making the Figures/Puppets (Grandpa and John).

Here is a photograph of all the materials you will need:



Please note, our matches are longer than regular matches.

We are using spent matches which are now safe.

Our screw driver is slightly narrower than our matches-quite tiny.

Our play dough is pink; green.

However, if you have dough or clay that is closer to a flesh colour- brown, black, cream, peach or yellow-that would be better?!

Ask Captain at the Helm (adult), by using a sharp knife on a cutting board, to cut one third off the top of one cork. This will be 'Grandpa'.



Cut the second cork in half, side to side. One half will make the 'boy, John'.

Ask Captain to carefully use the screw driver to make holes, at the correct angles, for two legs, two arms and a neck.

Gently, ease the matches into those holes and cut them to size.

Using the leftover pieces of cork, make 2 feet for each of the figures.

Using the same technique with the screwdriver, gently ease the matches into the cork feet. You shouldn't need to use glue.



Roll a ball of play dough and pop on the neck to make a head.

Using your leftover materials from making the cyclorama and film set, add hair, features (eyes, nose and mouth), clothes, hats and anything else you like to your figures.
