Choose which of these scenes you like best:

Collect whatever materials you have around your home (and garden).



We found strips of fabric that had been cut off when hemming trousers, paint or pens, a pencil.

And eg. used envelopes, dried grass etc, (after helping with the weeding in your garden).

Use your imagination.

We washed egg shells, very carefully, with washing up liquid.

Then we dried them in a warm place.

You'll need a glue stick or liquid glue.



First draw your outline with a pencil. Use the photos of Traprain or North Berwick Law as a guide



Then do the painting.



Then keep on building up your picture.

We used broken up egg shells for the dry stone wall.

And various other contrasting materials.
