Day 3

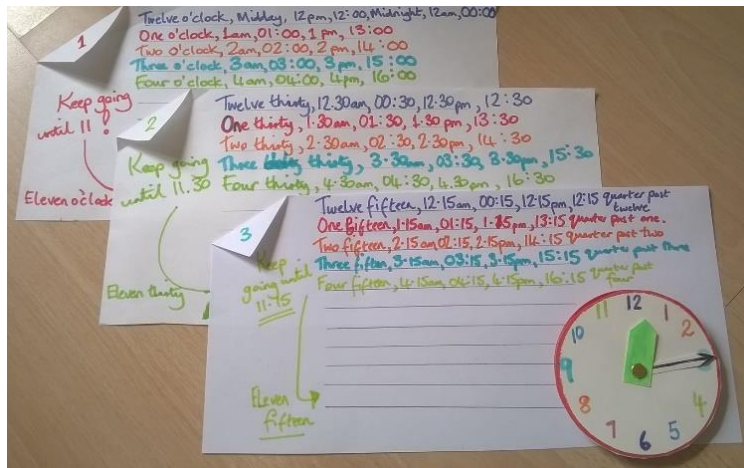
(Continued from Day 58 and Day 59)

4. Cut another piece of paper to fit around your container.
5. Now write out all the different ways of writing or saying the time on your paper.

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Day 4

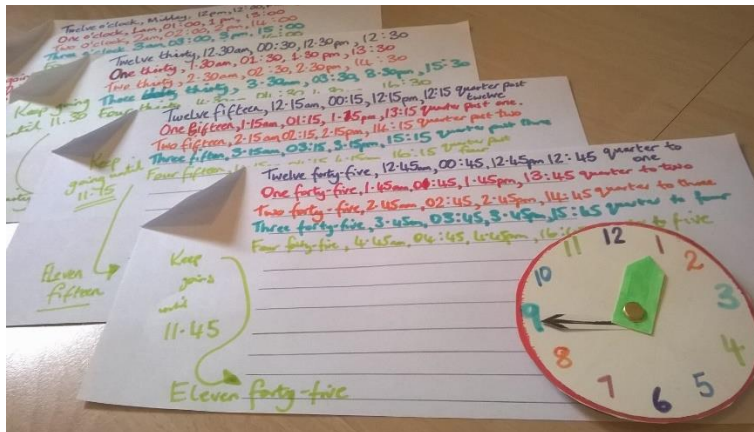
(Continued from Day 58 and Day 59)
