The flowers in the photographs could be described as 'weeds'.

They grow freely.



Perhaps you will pass a friend's garden or a wild patch of land where you can pick some wild flowers?

Flowers with a single layer of petals will work best.

Let's try pressing and drying them?!

Perhaps we can make them into a picture or a greetings card in 3 or 4 weeks' time?

Lay the flowers/leaves out carefully at one side of a sheet of absorbent paper, like kitchen paper or toilet paper.

Fold the paper over.

Carefully place your parcel within the pages of a heavy book.

Make sure you put extra paper within the pages to protect your book from staining.
