Here are the materials you will need:



We shaped the paper plate into a bowl/nest shape and held it with staples.

We stained it with the tea-bag from yesterday (we wetted it again).

We added twigs and grasses. White paper straws stained with the tea bag would do just as well.

We carefully washed and dried egg shells from our food waste recycle bin.

We would NEVER take birds eggs out of a nest.

The hardworking adult birds already have a very difficult time getting each egg to hatch safely. Sadly, many of the young chicks don't make it into adult life.

Therefore, EVERY egg is precious!

We painted our eggs blue.

When they were dry we added speckles.
